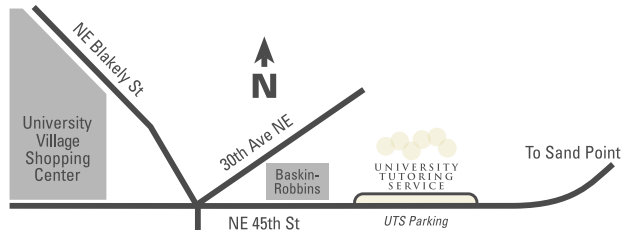


PHILOSOPHY
